## CORRECTIONAL OFFICERS MERITORIOUS SERVICE RECOGNITION AMENDMENT ACT OF 1984

IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

June 29, 1984

BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this act may be cited as the "Correctional Officers Meritorious Service Recognition Amendment Act of 1984".

Sec. 2. An Act To provide recognition for meritorious service by members of the police and fire departments of the District of Columbia, approved March 4, 1929 (45 Stat. 1556; D.C. Code, sec. 4-701 et seq.), is amended as follows:

(a) The long title is amended by striking the words "police and fire" and inserting the words "police, fire, and corrections" in their place.

(b) Section 1 (D.C. Code, sec. 4-701) is amended by striking the words "police and fire departments' and by inserting the words "police, fire, and core

rections departments" in their place.

(b) Section 2 (D.C. Code, sec. 4-702) is amended by striking the word "five" and inserting the word "six" in its place.

Sec. 3. This act shall take effect after a 30-day period of Congressional review following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by the Mayor, attion by the Council of the District of Columbia to override the veto) as provided in section 602(c)(1) of the District of Columbia Self-Government and Governmental Reorganization Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Code, sec. 1-233(c)(1).

Pursuant to Section 412 of the District of Columbia Self-Sovernment and Sovernmental Reorganization Act, P. L. 93-198, "the Act", the Council of the District of Columbia adopted Bill No. 5-342 on first and second readings, April 10, 1984 and April 30, 1984, respectively. Following the signature of the Hayor on May 9, 1984, this legislation was assigned Act No. 5-135, published in the May 25, 1984 edition of the D.C. Register, (Vol. 31 page 2549) and transmitted to Congress May 15, 1984 for a 30-day review, in accordance with Section 602 (c)(1) of
